EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2019 – Strengthening Community and Fostering Truth and Reconciliation through the Arts

Oh 2019.

If we had known then what we know now... You were a good year, in fact looking back, you were a GREAT year.

As we write this, the world has irrevocably changed. Due to the coronavirus pandemic, the Maury Young Arts Centre has been closed since mid-March. In a devastating time for arts, culture and entertainment organizations, Arts Whistler is striving to adapt quickly, providing arts leadership and virtual programming to ensure creativity continues during this challenging time.

As is the way of Whistler, together as a community we will get through this and come back stronger.

Now back to 2019. We continued to invest in community arts programming, marketing and opportunities for our arts community. We pursued goals to foster closer relationships with our Indigenous neighbours and address Truth and Reconciliation recommendations.

We hosted two art exhibitions featuring Lil'wat artists and produced the world premiere of *Utszan* – a powerful play written and performed by Yvonne Wallace from the Lil'wat Nation.

It's been an honour working with the Lil'wat community and building stronger friendships. These will undoubtedly lead to more partnerships with Indigenous artists and we look forward to those opportunities.

Following the infusion of \$489,500 from Canadian Heritage in 2016-17 (which funded *Arts Scene*, expanded our website and provided collaborative marketing to the arts sector), finding the funds to continue these many programs has been challenging but our team is creative and persistent. In 2019, we were successful in a grant application to the American Friends of Whistler for the funding of *Arts Scene*. In February 2020, we were fortunate to be selected by 100 Whistler Women Who Care as one of their quarterly fundraising recipients. Thanks to them, we will be publishing *Arts Scene* in 2021.

Arts Whistler is continually grateful for the support of our staff, members, volunteers, board of directors, partners, the RMOW and the community. We love what we do and who we do it for. Keep creating!

ARTS WHISTLER'S HEADQUARTERS

Arts Whistler manages the Maury Young Arts Centre on behalf of the RMOW, as Whistler's hub for arts, culture and inspiration. The building is home to a 230-seat theatre, a community art gallery, multi-purpose workshop, meeting rooms and technical services, all managed by Arts Whistler. The Arts Centre serves as the information centre for arts, culture and heritage programs and services. The Whistler Youth Centre, Teddy Bear Daycare and the Village Host program also operate from the Maury Young Arts Centre building.

THE GALLERY

Arts Whistler is home to Whistler's only free community art gallery. In 2019, hundreds of Sea to Sky artists exhibited in The Gallery through popular group shows like the *Anonymous Art Show* and *The Teeny Tiny Show* (*Size Does Matter*). *Arts Scene Uncovered* showcased the cover art submissions of local artists; *Whistler INKorporated* displayed the illustrative talents of our tattoo artists; young talent was exhibited with the *Whistler Secondary Senior Projects Art Show*; and *Off the Wall – the Occupational Hazard of Working at Arts Whistler* provided a peek into what art graces the household walls of Arts Whistler staff. We were thrilled to showcase the art and culture of the Lil'wat Nation with *The Land and People Are One* and proud to support rising-star artist Levi Nelson, a Lil'wat community member, with his first solo show *After the Blast, the Art of Levi Nelson*.

THE GIFT SHOP

In the lobby of Maury Young Arts Centre, The Gift Shop showcases a selection of quality, handcrafted artwork and artisan goods created by Sea to Sky artists. Visitors are able to view local wares from pottery to glass, jewelry to metal work, fabric arts, paintings, prints, art cards, and more. The display cases are often filled with the

work of artists featured in exhibits held in The Gallery. At any given time, The Gift Shop features the work of 25 to 35 different artists and artisans work, providing locals and visitors with a place to purchase unique made-in-Whistler artistic works.

Working with the RMOW, the arts, culture, heritage (ACH) sector and the Whistler community, Arts Whistler works to deliver the objectives in the plan and to foster a vibrant, dynamic and inclusive arts scene for both locals and visitors.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND SUPPORT

We are proud to support the community through arts scholarships and bursaries, prizes for local charities, member group grants, reduced venue rental for the arts sector, professional development for local artists and performers, and promotional support to the cultural sector.

We also collaborate with community not-for-profits on initiatives that support community-building. In 2019, Arts Whistler worked with:

- Whistler Community Services Society on a foodbank fundraiser, "Holiday Singapalooza".

Arts Whistler's community programming focuses on providing accessible arts experiences that spark inspiration and creative endeavours with offerings like Krafty Kids, Figure Drawing and Chicks with Picks.

We offer professional development workshops for artists (Arts-U) across the arts spectrum, to further their artistic skills and their business and promotional skills. 2019 featured Jess Robson on creating self-promotion that gets you the gig and Hjeron O'Sidhe on grant application tips and tricks that helps artists get funded.

Arts Whistler participates with the Whistler Chamber in the annual Whistler Excellence Awards with the Whistler Real Estate Company as the presenting sponsor for the Whistler Champion of Arts and Culture Award.

WHISTLER SUMMER STREET ENTERTAINMENT

On behalf of the RMOW with funds from the Resort Municipality Initiatives fund (RMI), Arts Whistler programs Whistler Summer Entertainment. The street entertainment program enables us to integrate arts and culture into the Village experience, showcasing artists and performers throughout the summer months. In 2019, Whistler Street Entertainment employed 82 artists and performers, of which 50% were from the Sea to Sky, including three youth performers from local high schools.

TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION

Our Indigenous neighbours have been on this land since time immemorial. With the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Calls to Action, the nation is working to shine light on that dark history and create pathways to healing and community building. Arts Whistler is committed to participating in this process, using the transformative power of arts and culture. In 2019, Arts Whistler produced three projects that showcased the beautiful culture of the Lil'wat Nation and the tremendous talent of Lil'wat artists. The results were incredibly positive and served to strengthen our relationship with the Lil'wat Nation.

PALA7MÍNTWAĹ I UCWALMÍCWA MÚTA7 TI TMICW THE LAND AND PEOPLE ARE ONE - Celebrating Lil'wat Arts and Culture

This exhibition celebrated the creative talents of the Lil'wat Nation, showcasing contemporary Lil'wat artists, carvers and artisans including carvers Jonathan Joe and Ashley Joseph, weaver Vera Edmonds, painters Rick Nelson and Levi Nelson and traditional regalia maker Lois Joseph. It also shared archival materials and photos that showcased the Lil'wat Rodeo.

ÚTSZAN

- World Premiere of a new Canadian Indigenous Play

Arts Whistler worked with community partners to present this compelling show that uncovered Indigenous knowledge, humour, strength and resilience through language reclamation. Written and performed by Lil'wat7úl artist Yvonne Wallace, *Útszan* (to make things better) is a passionate story about how language informs identity. As Canadians grapple with the brutal legacies of colonialism and how to forge a new way forward through the Truth and Reconciliation process, *Útszan* provided a forum for cultural learning, understanding and reconciliation. The cultural sharing and love in the theatre each night was quite profound.

AFTER THE BLAST: The Art of Levi Nelson

Having a place in both Indigenous and non-Indigenous cultures growing up, Levi Nelson shared his compelling perspective on the impacts of colonization, influenced by both cultural traditions and pop culture. Levi's first solo show, *After the Blast*, guided visitors on a journey through the metaphorical world of what happened to the aboriginal people of this country after first contact. Arts Whistler was thrilled to help Levi, a rising star artist, achieve a major milestone on his artistic journey. He sold many pieces at his first solo show, including a piece that is now in the Audain Art Museum permanent collection.

ANONYMOUS ART SHOW

Arts Whistler's most dynamic (and manic) gallery event celebrated its second year in 2019. The Anonymous Art Show has quickly become an exciting opportunity to buy original art produced by the Sea to Sky creative community. Adding to the mystery, each participating artist's identity – whether established or an up-and-coming talent – is kept secret until after purchase. The annual Anonymous Art Show is Arts Whistler's signature fundraiser. Funds support our community arts programs and the purchase of new theatre equipment. This event puts the fun in fundraising by inspiring hundreds of people to create art for the show and promotes art buying that makes more art possible. Thank you to everyone who contributes to this great event.

ART ON THE LAKE

Hosted in partnership with the RMOW, the rustic heritage house nestled in the woods on Alta Lake is the perfect location for summer art workshops. These one and two-day workshops are held between May and September and are taught by established local artists and guest artists from across Canada. This program increases cultural programming for destination visitors, as well as residents, and provides important economic and professional opportunities for visual artists.

WHISTLER CHILDREN'S FESTIVAL

Whistler's longest running community festival celebrated its 36th year in 2019. The Whistler Children's Festival has grown along with the community to provide a dynamic and unique cultural experience to more than 7,000 attendees. 2019 was challenged by a very rainy weekend, but we were thrilled to share the festival with more than 4,500 attendees, all decked out in their rain gear. In the past couple of years, the Festival has focused on the theme of "Imagination Unplugged", fostering youth engagement in the arts through hands-on experiential learning and encouraging parents to join in the fun with their kids, making the Whistler Children's Festival inspired, creative fun for the whole family.

HEAR AND NOW: WHISTLER'S LOCAL MUSIC FESTIVAL

Launched in 2016, *Hear and Now* is a free Fall for Arts event that celebrates Whistler's thriving local music scene. Over two days in late September, Sea to Sky musical acts are showcased in Village Square. 2019's line-up included Birdsong, Soul Mechanics, Hey Bartender!, Ev Kinsella, Conor Fitz, The Dead Millennials, FOMO, Dakota Pearl, Rachel Lewis, Right Turn Clyde, Madeline and Israelle, Vocalicious, Rutherford Creek Collective, Little Biggs Band, The Spruce Tops, Overcomes, The Courageous Mountain Rangers, and Moondrops.

WE HEART LOCAL ART

We Heart Local Art is a year-round showcase of local creativity. Featuring artists and artisans in non-traditional venues throughout Whistler Village and the valley. *We Heart Local Art* has 32 participating businesses throughout Whistler, showcasing the work of more than 50 local artists.

ARTS WHISTLER HOLIDAY MARKET

The 31st annual Arts Whistler Holiday Market faced a challenge in 2019. Longtime venue partner, the Whistler Conference Centre had a high-value conference group that weekend so we needed an alternate venue. The Westin Resorts & Spa, Whistler jumped in and were a fantastic partner. We're grateful to The Westin team, the vendors, our volunteers and our attendees for supporting the Holiday Market in a first-time venue. The vendors did a great job and more than 7,000 people attended. Bratz Biz continues to be a lively part of the market, fostering the entrepreneurship of over 34 youth vendors.

Arts Whistler often collaborates with community partners in our collective efforts to grow the arts sector. 2019 saw us collaborate on the following events:

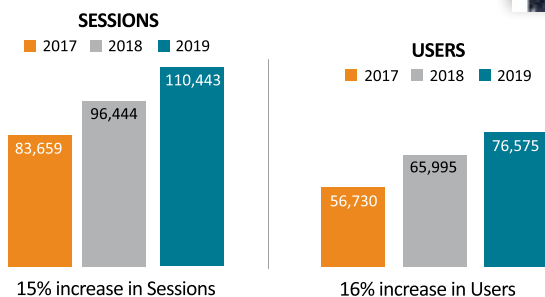
- International Women's Day – An annual showcase of female musicians and fundraiser for Howe Sound Women's Centre.

- Federal All-Candidates meeting – Arts Whistler provided venue and hosting supporting to the Whistler Chamber in hosting an All-Candidates meeting for the riding.
- Emily Carr Film Night – Arts Whistler collaborated with the Audain Art Museum to offer films about the great Emily Carr, augmenting the Audain's exhibition *Emily Carr: Fresh Seeing – French Modernism and the West Coast*.
- The Point Takeover at the Arts Centre – During Fall for Arts, we welcome the Point Artist-Run Centre to take over the Arts Centre with an encore performance of their summer Flag Stop Festival original and local play. This year's edition, *About the Moose*, by Stephen Vogler was a comic hit.
- Holiday Singapalooza – Arts Whistler partners with Barbed Choir's talented and hilarious choral director, Jeanette Bruce, for Holiday Singapalooza, a fundraiser for the Whistler Food Bank.

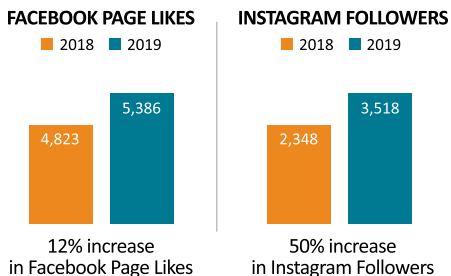

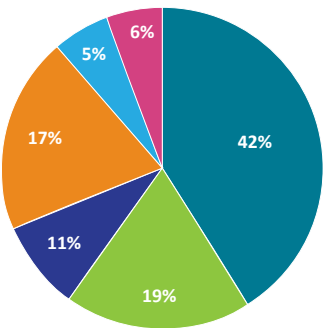

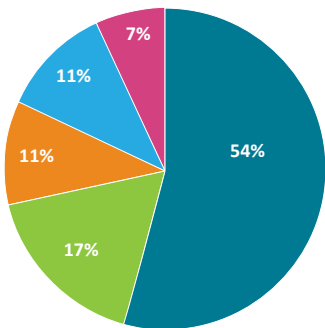
